



IRC Off Road COVID-19 Procedures

Attendance:

All racers, attendees, helpers, and any other people in attendance at the track MUST sign into the attendance register. It is a Government requirement that the club keeps records (name and contact information) of each person who was at the track during a race day.

Any person who is showing ANY sickness/flu/fever symptoms MUST NOT attend. If you are showing any flu like symptoms, you must stay at home.

If anyone who was in attendance at a race day tests positive to COVID-19 within 28 days following the event, you MUST contact IRC Off Road so we can inform the attendance register of potential exposure. Any person who is asked to leave the premises by health officials OR IRC Committee members MUST do so immediately. Failure to do so will lead to authorities being notified and details of the incident being handed over.

Race Control/Canteen:

Due to the size of the canteen/race control, each room respectively will be limited to ONE PERSON ONLY. Please be aware that this may increase the waiting time for race fees/food/drink to be served, so please be understanding of this.

Drivers Stand:

The drivers stand will be limited to 7 people MAX at any given time. There will be clear markers placed on the stand to indicate where drivers MUST stand. These will be placed at 1.5m intervals. In addition, racers waiting to enter the stand MUST wait until EVERY person from the race before has vacated the stand before entering the stand.

While waiting to enter the drivers stand, drivers must leave a 1.5m gap to the next person.

Pit Lane:

The pit area is limited to one pit person per driver, and the pit person must stand directly below their respective driver. This will ensure each pit person is maintaining social distancing in pit lane.

Pit Area/Carpark:

Social distancing MUST be obeyed in the pit/carpark area. 3x3m tents are limited to MAX 2 people within the tent. Each person MUST have their own table and be minimum 1.5m apart. If your tent is smaller than 3x3m, it is limited to ONE PERSON only. Attendees that LIVE together may pit under the same tent.

There will be hand sanitiser throughout the pit areas – IRC Off Road asks all attendees to consistently sanitise their hands throughout the day.

Marshalling:

Where possible, marshals are to wear gloves while marshalling. This is as much a safety aspect as it is a contamination issue. For those who do not wear gloves, you MUST sanitise your hands BEFORE and AFTER marshalling each race.

Blow/Wash Station:

All racers MUST sanitise their hands before using the blow/wash station to clean cars. The sanitiser will be located at the blow/wash station for racers convenience.

Sharing Tools/Parts:

Sharing of tools under normal circumstances is not allowed. In the case where a tool OR part NEEDS to be shared, the tool/part must be sanitised before and after use. There will be a spray bottle of sanitiser located at the canteen for this. If the tool/part needs to be shared, please obtain the sanitiser from the canteen to sanitise the tool/part.

IRC understands these procedures are abnormal and may seem excessive, but it is everyone's responsibility to limit and stop the spread of COVID-19, ensuring we can continue to race in the future.

Failure to abide by the procedures set out above OR in the drivers briefing will lead to warnings being given to the person(s) not obeying the procedures. Consistent failure to adhere to these warnings will lead to the person(s) being asked to leave the premises. If this direction is not met, authorities will be notified and details of the person(s) will be handed over.
